



Paul Jordison Scholarship Fund

The Paul Jordison Scholarship Fund Committee is established to award annual scholarships to CUPE Local 966 members (or their dependants) that are pursuing education at the post-secondary level. The fund was established in memory of Paul Jordison, a long-standing CUPE 966 National Representative of impeccable record. It is hoped that recipients of this award will continue to demonstrate his spirit of solidarity and community activism.

Terms of Reference

The Paul Jordison Scholarship Fund (PJSF) Committee shall:

1. consist of four members in good standing appointed by the Executive Board every two years, one of whom must be a currently serving member of the Executive Committee who also serves as the Committee chair;
2. meet by October 20 of that year to review applicants;
3. decide on up to 10 recipients based on the agreed upon Criteria (see below) by October 20;
4. notify scholarship recipients before the October General Membership Meeting by letter and/or electronic means;
5. announce scholarship recipients at the October General Membership Meeting;
6. recommend that cheques be sent to recipients by November 1;
7. In the event of outstanding funds, the Committee reserves the right to distribute those funds as required;
8. reserves the right to review the documentation submitted and to request further documentation as required.

Note: Previously awarded applicants will only be considered only if the maximum number of applicants does not exceed the maximum of 10 applicants.

Criteria

The PJSF Committee shall use the following criteria, as stipulated, to determine the recipients of the Paul Jordison Scholarship.

1. Must be:
 - a. a member in good standing who is continuing with a post-secondary education
 - b. a dependant (under the age of 25) of a member in good standing who is continuing with a post-secondary education.
2. Verification of tuition paid to the attending College or University
3. In a minimum of 300 words but not exceeding 400 words; in your own words; describe "Organized Labour's contribution to the welfare of the people of Canada".
4. Letter of Reference from someone who has known the applicant for two or more years

Paul Jordison Scholarship

Part One

Ten Scholarships valued at \$1000.00 each are available annually for attendance at any recognized post-secondary institution in the Country of Canada.

Those eligible are:

- a. Union members in good standing who are continuing with a post-secondary education
- b. Dependents (under the age of 25) of Union members in good standing who are continuing with a post-secondary education.

Applications must be on the prescribed form and must be received by the Paul Jordison Scholarship Fund (PJSF) Committee of CUPE Local 966 by October 20 of each calendar year. All criteria must be adhered to in order for the application to be reviewed. The PJSF Committee will review all applications received for the period beginning September 12 to October 16 of each calendar year. A recommendation from the Chair of the PJSF Committee, in cooperation with the other Committee members, will be presented to the Executive Committee for endorsement each year where applications exist to be reviewed. The ten scholarships will be awarded at the regularly scheduled General Membership Meeting in October. Any inquiries regarding the scholarships should be directed to the PJSF Committee Chair. Information and printable application forms regarding scholarships are available from both the CUPE Local 966 website and at the 966 office, located at 259 Trader's Blvd, Unit 11 in Mississauga.

All applications must be signed by your Unit Vice President prior to submitting to the Local by October 16th, 2017.

Successful applicants will be asked to provide verification of completion of area of studies to be eligible for any future scholarships.
